

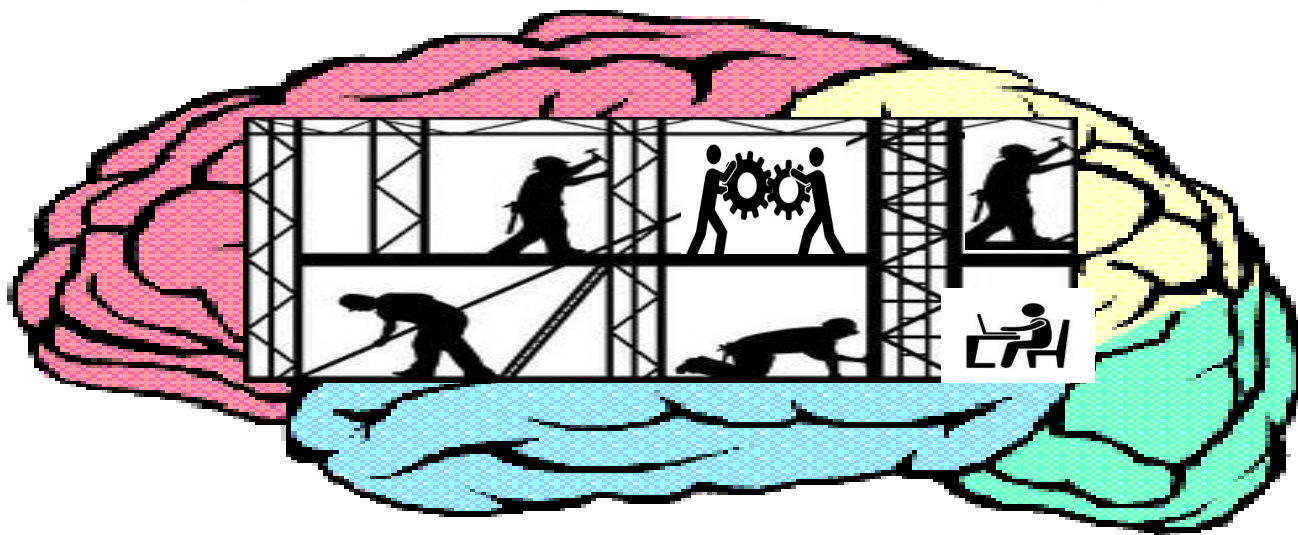

A growing body of research supports a connection between adverse childhood experiences and negative behavioral and health outcomes, such as obesity, substance abuse, and depression, later in life.**
