So you're wondering....what big changes were there in the premium book this year? Now you have the short list! Of course – this is not everything – but the major additions or changes that might have an impact on your county fair experience are listed here!

Page 6 (Livestock Entry)

The Breeding Swine Show will be held on Monday, August 5. Trailers will be able to enter the fairgrounds beginning at noon, and will be able to unload Breeding Swine into the barn until 5:00 pm. Breeding Swine ID verification will be 5:00 – 6:00 pm. The show begins at 6:30 pm. At the end of the show, all pens must be cleaned, all swine must leave the fairgrounds, and the arena must be taken down.

All other Livestock Exhibits (including Market Swine), are not allowed to enter the fairgrounds until 8AM on Tuesday, August 5th.

Page 11 (Static Exhibitors)

Crafts and Fine Arts will be registered for separately this year

Page 20 (Livestock Exhibitors)

4-Hers exhibiting livestock at the County Fair are responsible for the care and feeding of animals they exhibit. Please refrain from utilizing a common water tank – this spreads disease quickly from animal to animal!

Page 21 (Animal Sales and Advertising)

No animals may be advertised for sale and no farm, ranch, or sale signs may be displayed or worn. The only signs other than 4-H stall cards, club banners, and champion/reserve champion signs that may be displayed are educationally – based signs with performance or pedigree information, but no owner/exhibitor information.

Page 23 (Beef)

Crossbred dairy steers will compete for state fair trips with the beef market steers, not the purebred dairy steers.

Page 27 (Dairy and Meat Goat)

Goat Costume Show: Friday, August 9, 5:00 pm – Pre-registration is required by July 9th.

Any Meat Jr Doe Kid born May 15th – May 31st, and Dairy Jr Doe Kid born May 15th - June 30th, must submit ID information to the 4-H office by July 1st in order to be considered fully eligible.

Page 32 (Rabbit)

All breeds recognized by the American Rabbit Breeders Association are eligible. Rabbits will be judged according to ARBA standards. Any Rabbit found to not meet ARBA standards, will automatically receive a red ribbon

Page 35 (Livestock Auction)

4-H members must bring their own animals into the sale ring. If you are not at the ring when your animal is to be entering – they will skip to the next animal and your animal will not go through the ring.
